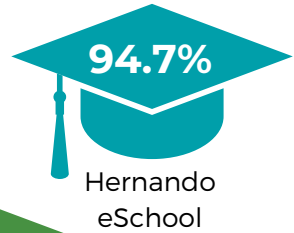
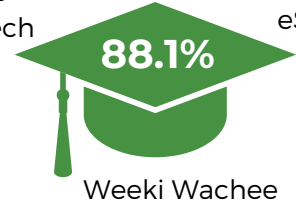
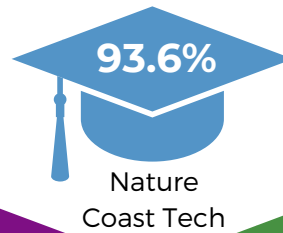
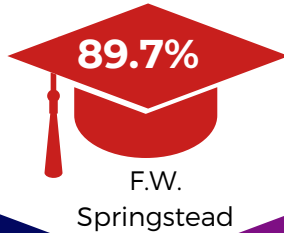
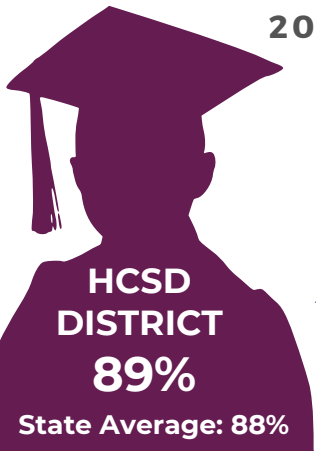
The Hernando School District has earned a grade of "B" from the Florida Department of Education each year since 2015.

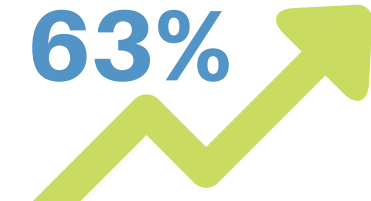
