How FL-PBS relates to Multi – Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)

MTSS is a multi- tiered support program that uses a problem solving approach. It provides additional academic/behavioral support to students in need. There are three tiers in which Tier 1 focuses on a more universal or classroom approach. Tier 2 provides additional small group support and Tier 3 is intensive and provides more individual support.

Students who need additional behavioral support will be included in skill building intervention strategies, as needed, along with classroom based interventions. Parent/guardian communication will take place through parent conferences, phone calls and/or notes in the agenda.

Our school has 6 expectations that are applied in every setting across the school.

What is Positive Behavior Support?

Positive Behavior Support (PBS) is a school wide initiative to promote positive behavior in the school setting. It is a proactive approach in that the students are taught what is expected of them in all school settings (i.e. classroom, lunchroom, bus, playground, walkways, etc.) Students will be rewarded frequently for their appropriate behavior. It promotes a positive school environment where students and teachers feel appreciated, safe and respected.

Students are acknowledged and rewarded for making good choices and putting the SPLASH expectations into action. Students may earn SPLASH cards for prizes, monthly SPLASH Clubs (i.e. drawing, poetry) and each semester, SUPERSPLASH (i.e. Fun in the Sun, Gingerbread Jamboree). There are a variety of monthly educational Splash Clubs for students to expand their horizons. SPLASH Clubs include: PowerPoint, Gardening, Spanish, Rockets, Puppets, Legos, Running, Drama, Painting and many more.
