Thanks to half-cent sales tax dollars, HCSD Facilities has been busy this year with a number of projects to repair and restore school buildings and other facilities. To name a few: Fox Chapel Middle is enjoying new ceiling and LED lights; Eastside Elementary has a new roof and HVAC; and Suncoast Elementary has a new emergency generator! Did you know that there is a Citizens Advisory Committee that reviews all sales tax projects? Investment of millage funds is also having a positive impact on our schools! Millage dollars have been used to purchase all new instruments, band uniforms, concert attire; \$140,000 for athletic safety equipment, \$750,000 to upgrade school and stadium sound systems \$470,000 distributed for school needs.
