Dress for Success: The Spirit of DSPMS Dress Code

- Clothing is to support the professional academic atmosphere of a school classroom.
- Attire must not be disruptive or distracting to the learning environment.
- Clothing, except school-sponsored items, cannot have graphics or writing larger than a credit card.
- Illuminated clothing, illuminated accessories, costume-like apparel, costume-like clothing, and costume-like accessories are forbidden.
- All clothing is to be neat, clean, without rips or holes, and appropriately fitted.
- Undergarments are NOT to be visible.

Appropriate Tops

MATERIAL:

- must be in good repair
- cotton or cotton-polyester blend
- NOT stretchy/spandex/form fitting

STYLE:

- Polo/golf; with collar, and 2-8 buttons
- Must have short sleeve or long sleeves
- Button down permitted (buttoned)
- **New- Any Parrott Middle School t-shirt**
Students must wear dress code bottoms

FIT:

- No tie-ups, strings, or zippers on tops.
- All Shirts **MUST** be long enough to cover the midriff area when both arms are raised. However, students have the option to wear shirts tucked in or worn out.

COLORS/PATTERNS:

- Plaid, striped, or solid colors. Shirts with buttons must be buttoned up (not worn open).
- Solid under shirts may be worn under approved tops but should not be seen.
- Solid color sweaters or sweatshirts can be worn with an approved top underneath.

Appropriate Bottoms

MATERIAL:

- must be in good repair
- cotton or cotton-polyester blend
- NO stretchy/spandex/form fitting materials

STYLE:

- Pants, trousers, capris, joggers, skirts, skorts, shorts
 - NO sweats or athletic wear

FIT:

- Pants are to be regular fit/style with a boot cut or slightly flared pant leg
- NO form-fitting bottoms
- Pants must have the ability to be gently pulled away from the skin.
- Ankle slits may be no more than 2 inches from the bottom
- Pant length will be proper as to not pile up on shoes or drag the floor.
- Worn at the waist
- Shorts/skorts are to be properly fitted and may not be shorter than 4 inches above the top of the knee cap.
- Skirts are to be the appropriate size for the student. Length (including slits) will extend to NO MORE THAN 2 inches above the knee.

COLORS/PATTERNS:

- dark blue, black, gray and/or khaki **solid color**
- **NEW- Student may wear jeans- following the above rules**
 - No jean shorts/skirts/skorts

ACCESSORIES

- Belts may be worn to hold pants at the proper position at the waist.
- No character-like, animal-like, costume-like, or illuminated accessories of any kind.
This includes shoes, jackets, hair bands, gloves, purses, book bags, etc.
dark blue, black, gray and/or khaki **solid color** leggings may be worn under skirts, skorts, and shorts as long as they are in good repair

Head coverings cannot be worn on campus; No bandanas of any kind are permitted

JACKETS: NO PULL-OVER HOODIES.

- Jackets must have a front zipper or buttons/snaps.
- Jackets may NOT be worn to hide dress code violations.
- Zippered jackets must be in accordance with School Board policy.

Appropriate SHOES

- Shoes/boots must have a closed back, or strapped heel.
- Athletic shoes or tennis shoes are preferable.

NON PERMISSIBLE TOPS

- NO tight fitting shirts/tops
- NO see-through (sheer) shirts
- NO large logos or emblems
- NO capped shoulders or sleeveless
- NO spandex, or stretch material
- NO zippers, rings, or lace on shirts.
- NO bare midriffs.
- NO Goth-style rings and zippers
- NO Sweaters/ sweatshirts worn to hide dress code violations

NON PERMISSIBLE BOTTOMS

- NO sweats, spandex, parachute pants, jeggings, athletic pants, stretchy or nylon materials of any kind.
- NO multi-colored leggings/knee-socks or fishnet hose
- NO visible undergarments through or above pants
- NO tapered pant legs or skinny (form/tight) fit
- NO tight fitting pants
- NO below the waist or hip-huggers
- NO Gang, Punk or Goth style
- NO wide flares or lace-up pants
- NO cut-offs or frayed bottoms
- NO chains hanging from pants
- NO bare midriffs

NON PERMISSIBLE SHOES

- NO heels higher than 2 inches
- NO lighted/illuminated shoes
- NO backless or platform shoes
- NO board (wheeled) shoes
- NO slippers, slides or flip flop style shoes

CONSEQUENCES

Quarter 1:

Note: Parents will be called to bring clothes each time the student is in violation during the first quarter. Child will stay in the ISS room and will not be permitted to return to class until he or she is in proper uniform.
