

District Rezoning update

Last night, the Hernando School Board voted against making any changes to school zones for the 2024-25 school year. Current school attendance boundaries will remain unchanged. Next steps will center around a plan to expand existing schools, where feasible.

Superintendent John Stratton said staff has already been working on a plan to build additional classrooms at schools that are currently overcrowded.

Superintendent Stratton applauded the efforts of the District Rezoning Committee in their months-long effort to develop a viable rezoning plan. The committee was comprised of business leaders, parents, community advocates, retired educators, school administrators and district staff. "Rezoning is a complicated undertaking that impacts everyone in our community," said Stratton. "Each member accepted our invitation to be part of this difficult work and we are grateful for their collaboration and care as they took on this challenge."
