

Our Goals for Student Achievement

School Goals: By increasing student engagement in the classroom, Deltona will increase the Federal Index for students with disabilities and black population to 41%. In addition, DES will increase daily student attendance from 90% to 92% or more.

- In ESE and ESE Pre K, our school will focus on curriculum and learning, social emotional behavior, independent functioning, and communication.
- <u>In Pre- K</u>, our school will focus on the following area(s): letter, number, and animal recognition and counting.
- In Kindergarten, our school will focus on letter & sound recognition, phonics, writing, listening comprehension, vocabulary, number sense, number computations, science and social studies skills.
- <u>In 1st Grade</u>, our school will focus on phonics, reading, writing, vocabulary, number computations, science, and social studies skills.
- In 2nd Grade, our school will focus on reading fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, number computations, word problems, science and social studies skills.
- In 3rd Grade, our school will focus on reading comprehension, math concepts and skills, including multiplication, division, and fractions, as well as science and social studies concepts.
- In 4th Grade, our school will focus on problem solving and math facts, developing essay writing skills, reading comprehension and vocabulary, Florida history, and science processes.
- In 5th Grade, our school will focus on reading comprehension, vocabulary, developing and strengthening writing with evidence, number sense, problem-solving skills, science, and social studies concepts.

Teachers, Parents, Students-Together for Success

In the Classroom

The classroom teacher will work with students and their families to support students' successes in science, reading and math. Some of our key connections with families may include but are not limited to:

- Provide parents with home learning resources full of fun materials for Math, Science, and ELA.
- Monthly newsletter/communication which will feature games that families can play to review the vocabulary words we have introduced in our classroom.
- Share monthly links to family-friendly websites for building reading, vocabulary, math skills, and science activities.
- Students will bring their charged laptop to school every day.

Deltona Students

Deltona students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and show their Deltona PRIDE in science, math, and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Work with my family using the home learning resources to practice my standards.
- Play the games/activities from the home learning resources.
- Attend school every day, and complete school and homework assignments daily.
- Have 20/20 log signed daily.
- Attend tutoring and computer camp.
- YMCA homework help and computer lab
- Ask for help when needed.
- Bring my charged laptop to school every day.

At Home

Deltona parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' successes in reading, science and math. Families may have other ideas to add to the list.

- Have fun with learning. Work with my child using the home learning resources to reinforce skills.
- Read with my child, practice vocabulary, and check to see if homework is completed daily.
- Follow up with the teacher if needed.
- Be present and available. Do research to find out what resources are provided at the school and in the community to help with my child's specific needs.
- Communicate with the teacher, check online grades, check communication app daily for any important updates.
- Make sure my child attends school every day.
- Discuss daily school and classroom happenings with my child.
