* placed **after** the cover page and before the introduction.

*The page numbers of the sections in the body of the paper much match those in the Table of Contents.

THINGS TO AVOID IN TOC

- I.Do Not Say "Body Section"
- * sections need actual titles- label by topic of the section
- 2. Use numbers not letters

PAPER BASICS

Body:

- Use numbers or Roman Numerals
 [match the table of contents] for section titles
- 2. All subheading should be formatted the same i.e.. Size, font, bold, underline
- 3. Indent new paragraphs
- 4. So NOT leave extra spacing between paragraphs
- 5. DO NOT have huge word walls, sections van have multiple paragraphs!
