Every Child a Swimmer talking points

- 1. A 2020 poll of Florida registered voters confirmed that over 90% believe every child should be taught how to swim.
- 2. Most school systems are not positioned to provide swim lessons for their students
- 3. To raise the issue with parents, SB-358 simply requires that the school system, during the kindergarten entry process, asks the parents if they provided swim lessons to their child.
- 4. Parents can voluntarily answer the question or not answer the question without cause: this bill is not a mandate to require swim lessons.
- 5. The SB-358 will not impact the budget of any school system.
- 6. Once learned, basic swim skills will stay with each individual for the rest of their life. There are numerous positive health benefits gained from swimming regardless of age.
- 7. The long-term impact of this bill will be to create a safer, healthier citizenry since many parents will take action to teach their child to swim.
- 8. Research validates that children who learn to swim at an early age actually develop mentally and physically at a measurably better level, even performing better in school.
- 9. There are numerous scholarship programs for financial support should the parents be unable to afford but desire to provide swim lessons for their child.
